Pre-race Staging

For the public criteriums, riders must report to the start line approximately 10 minutes before the scheduled start. Race PA system will make announcement.

For the campus relays, riders must report to staging area (location TBA on at registration) 15 minutes before the scheduled start. Race PA system will make official announcement.

Race Warm-up

Race course will not be available for warm up when other races are going on. It is recommended that riders either bring stationary trainers, or warm up on streets close to the course.

JAYHAWK CYCLING CLASSIC 2004

The 2004 Jayhawk Cycling Classic is a weekend long event which includes a collegiate stage race, as well as a Criterium and relay for campus groups and public competitors on Sunday, May 2nd. The public Criterium and relays will be held on the campus of the University of Kansas. The course starts in front of Strong Hall on Jayhawk Boulevard, heads west to the Chi-Omega Fountain, turns north on West Campus Road, turns right on Memorial Drive, and then heads right on Mississippi Street, where the course meets up with Jayhawk Boulevard.

Race Categories

Public Men's A: This category is meant for riders who are experienced racers and have previous competition experience. Prizes will be given to the top 5 riders.

Public Men's B: This category is meant for riders who are new to competition and racing. Also, this category is meant for a racer not wanting to compete in the Men's A division. Prizes will be given to the top 5 riders.

Public Women: This category is for all females. Prizes will be given to the top 5 riders.

Campus Group Relay: This category is for KU students only. A minimum of three students and a maximum of four students comprise a team, and a team may be all male, all female, or co-ed. Prizes will be given to the top teams in these three categories.

Public Relay: This category is open to all riders. A minimum of three riders and a maximum of four riders comprise a team, and a team may be all male, all female, or co-ed. Prizes will be given to the top teams in these three categories.

Race Registration

All registration is done at the race course, and registration will be open at 6:45, and will close 30 minutes before each race. (That means no late fees!!!) Registration will be located in front of Wescoe Hall.

Race fee is \$15 for the public races, and \$30 for the relays. In addition, all riders must pay \$5 additional for USCF one-day license, unless they have a USCF annual license.

In addition to USCF waiver, riders must complete and sign KU waiver as well. Racers under 18 must have parent or legal guardian sign this waiver, and there are no exceptions!! Sorry.

Remember, USCF category NOT required to race, but \$5 one-day license is required for riders not having an annual USCF license. All races include \$2 for USCF insurance and \$1 for KCA improvement fund.
